eSemp was created in 2012 by Seniors Españoles para la Cooperación Técnica - SECOT. Since its creation, more than 7,917 students have attended its courses and they have dedicated over 4,186 hours to training. The training is intended for entrepreneurs, micro-enterprises, SMEs, startups, as well as unemployed and non-profit organisations, and aims to provide them with useful tools for an effective entrepreneurship and employment.

The objective of the initiative was to raise awareness for senior potential in the city of Turin, not just in terms of the opportunities offered by the Senior Expert organisations that are part of CESES (VSP, Seniores Italia Lazio and ISES), but in terms of the commitment towards social issues and towards young people in the world of professional senior volunteering. This initiative was also able to shed a light on intergenerational cooperation and the concept of Active Ageing.

"Mentoring program for startup-incubator"

**ASEP** 

In 2019, ASEP was invited to work out a mentoring concept for technology focused startups together with the local incubator "Gründerzentrum build!" in Carinthia (Austria). The target was to provide the best professional support for their startups, whilst also considering an individual mentee/mentor match. ASEP has provided around 30 male and female mentors with various backgrounds, experiences and social skills. All individuals are well selected Senior Experts who are willing to share their expertise with young startups.

This programme is managed and animated by ECTI, Senior Volunteers Experts Association, in favor of SME's (Small and Medium Enterprises) in the sector of Hotels, Restaurants, Cafés, Food & Beverage activities, retail shops, and small entrepreneurs, with the aim of helping them digitise their businesses. They help small companies or a one-person business with very limited financial resources to learn more about using the Internet, social medias and digital tools in order to improve and develop their business models.

Italian Senior Expert Service (ISES)

This initiative focuses on participants within the family environment and their successful integration into the working environment. Three senior experts are currently engaged in the initiative, impacting over one hundred individuals across two organisations. The project's aim is to notably reduce states of maladjustment achieved through the establishment of mentor-mentee relationships. Personal interviews and remote checks further contribute to the successful initiative by ensuring ongoing support and guidance, enhancing the overall well-being and adaptability of the participants.
